Genesis & Development

Laxmi Narayan Seva Pratisthan, a registered organisation, was founded in 1990 and registered under society registration act in 1993 by a team of professionals to devise and institutionalize methods which would effectively ameliorate the pathetic conditions of the marginalized and vulnerable communities of the Jajpur district of Odisha. The agency, engaged in promotion of participatory approaches in developmental activities, believes that the goal of sustainable development and prosperity can be achieved only through decisive participation of the local communities aided by an enabling role by service providers such as government departments and agencies.

Guided by its long term mission and vision, the organization is currently working in Jajpur, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj and Bhadrak district of Odisha state. The focus of the programme is on enhancement of local yet sustainable livelihood practices, violation of human right issues, increasing availability of local employment and health.

One of the key objectives of Laxmi Narayan Seva Pratisthan is to demonstrate that the local institutions can manage their natural resources and livelihood options efficiently and sustainably with adequate and appropriate support. 

In order to translate the vision into reality, Laxmi Narayana Seva Pratisthan has been work hard to achieve the following objectives.

- To work with the groups of people on their problems through program planning, leadership, training and networking with partners and allies for Capacity building & providing support through organizational development assistance.
- To conduct Action / Research activities on different issues and share the findings with the partners and the networks in order to highlight the key areas.
- To develop an enabling environment through civic / Skill Development education, lobbying, advocacy and capacity building to exercise human rights and democracy.

Area of Operation & Beneficiaries Covered

In a short span of its existence Laxmi Narayan Seva Pratisthan has been working in a comparatively large geographical area of Jajpur district. Apart from that the agency also working in Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj and Bhadrak district also. At present the organization is working in Jajpur NAC and 5 blocks of Jajpur district. The different blocks are known as Jajpur, Bari, Dasarathapur, Rasulpur, Korei, Danagadi, Sukinda and Binjharpur.



Priority Areas of Intervention

Laxmi Narayan Seva Pratisthan has a wide range of activities to its credit. The core areas of activities have been identified on a priority basis are Skill Development, Rights of Persons with Disability, Nursing education, natural resource management, awareness generation, protection and strengthening of environment, employment generation, women's development, strengthening SHG Groups, formation of Residential Schools, youth Development, water and sanitation, education, health and reproductive child health, socio-economic research.

Infrastructure: The foundation of the organization is strong. The people are its pillar of strength and the beneficiaries are its partners. The office is running with professional staffs who enjoy absolute freedom in implementing the projects. The governing body members, office bearers, the advisory board, and young male and female volunteers are full time social workers of repute, social activists and brain tank of the organization. The organization is having necessary machineries, equipments and technical staffs for conducting all training programs.

Staff Profiles

The human resources of the organization consist of professionally qualified and profusely experienced personnel who have command over wide areas of development issues that support the going activities. The Staff strength of the Human development consists of personnels and Village Level Animators. Currently 50nos. of Full Time Staff, 10nos. of Part Time Staff and 40nos. of Volunteers are available in the organization to look after the overall programmes.

Programme Focus : Activities and achievements

Educational Programme

Education is both the means as well as the end to a better life; means, because it empowers an individual to earn his/her livelihood and the end because it increases one's awareness on a range of issues – from healthcare to appropriate social behavior to understanding one's rights, and in the process evolve as a better citizen.

LNSPs educational initiatives includes:

1. **Residential Primary School for Sheduled Tribe Children** at Ragadi of Jajpur district where 100 numbers of ST students has enrolled. The programme is being implemented with the financial support of the Govt. of India since 1999.



2. **Adult Education and Vocational Training Centre** for rural women. This centre is established in Ahiyas, Ragadi, Korei and Bihari

village of Jajpur district. During the current financial year total 120 numbers of SCs and OBCs women were provided such types of trainings.

3. **Centre for education for Minority Children**, the agency has set up 3 nos. of educational centre at Gopalpur, Ahiyas and Binjharpur area of Jajpur district. In addition to imparting general education, the children also gain different types of Coaching on Orissa JEE and other Competitive examination and vocational education on skill development training such as Kitchen Garden and tailoring training for women.
4. **Career Counseling Centre** at Jajpur Town where counseling was given on military, para military and police services.
5. **Special School for Child Labour**: The Organisation has already setup a special school for child labour with financial support of Govt. of Odisha. In special school where children were provided with vocational education.



6. **Educational Complex for ST Girls**: The organization has set up educational complex for ST girls at Barbil of Keonjhar district. 100 nos. of ST girls admitted in the school. In addition to imparting general education, the children were provided with training on Yoga and provisions for outdoor games and sports are also available in the educational complex.

Awareness Generation Programme

Wide publicity of Govt. welfare scheme

In Orissa there is no reason why people in a district should come to Bhubaneswar to get their problems solved. This negates the very notion of self-governance. In order to bring governance closer to people, every district will have a District Government with all necessary powers. All local governments will be empowered with funds, functions and functionaries. Orissa is a state of villages, 80% of the population are staying in rural village. Observing the social and economic states of rural people, one can easily find out the acute poverty of the village. Many welfare schemes and programmes has introduced by Govt. for poverty eradication of the rural areas, but the people are not yet to get all sorts of the benefits provided by the government. Because people staying in villages don't know about the policies and guideline of Govt. scheme meant for their welfare. For which the beneficiary's are not getting the welfare services and only the elite groups who are involved in such welfare scheme are always benefited. The only reason for this is lack of proper information. So LNSP of Jajpur has been involving general people in its institutional revolution i.e. Power to people by ensuring a Citizen centered governance process that will establish the link between general population and the government. So to spread information on Govt. welfare scheme and programmes among the people of Jajpur district, intensive publicity was made through awareness,



training programme in which the general people can know their rights and duties and government welfare programmes.

Programme on Consumer Rights Awareness

Consumer protection laws are designed to ensure fair competition and the free flow of truthful information in the marketplace. The laws are designed to prevent businesses that engage in fraud or specified unfair practices from gaining an advantage over competitors and may provide additional protection for the weak and those unable to take care of themselves. Consumer Protection laws are a form of government regulation which protects the interests of consumers. Even though strong and clear laws exist in India to protect consumer rights, the actual plight of Indian consumers could be declared as completely dismal. Very few consumers are aware of their rights or understand their basic consumer rights. Of the several laws that have been enacted to protect the rights of consumers in India, the most significant is the Consumer Protection Act, 1986. Under this law, everyone can exercise their consumer rights for the goods and services purchased by them. The present society particularly the illiterate in rural areas are being exploited by the entrepreneurs/tradesmen in almost all products (Consumable and non

consumable). In this way the agency trying to aware people about the exploitation had done by the entrepreneurs/ tradesmen through seminars workshops and celebrating the Consumer day. In the awareness process the consumers were sensitized on the following aspects of exploitation

like adulteration in consumable products, ISI mark and AGA mark of products and validity period/expiry date and so on. The agency implemented the consumer rights programme in different blocks of Jajpur district.

HIV/AIDS Awareness Programme

In the modern world, AIDS has appeared as the deadly monster, which claims millions of lives each year all over the world. A large number of persons are also affected and being affected by it and counting their days as no curable measures has been discovered so far. This gloomy situation is the outcome of sexual relationship, unsafe blood transfusion and use of contaminated injections syringes etc. which are as a whole, evolves from ignorance from the part of people and failure of the government and non government machinery to spread adequate awareness in this regard. Since the disease has no cure rather involves social ostracism, many people who have been affected by the disease keep it as a secret and go on passing a normal life without adopting protective measures which spreads the disease furthermore. This situation moves The Human Development to come forth with a number of programmes with the aim to create awareness among the people and serve the victims. Time to time the organization holds several events of public awareness, training of volunteers, interaction with the health Authority and organization, counseling to the victims etc. in its operational area. It conducts awareness sessions for youth, slum dwellers, workers, SHg leaders, adolescents group and sensitize them about HIV/AIDS.

Programme on Tuberculosis Awareness

Tuberculosis (TB) is a common and often deadly infectious disease caused by mycobacteria, usually *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* in humans. Tuberculosis usually attacks the lungs but can also affect other parts of the body. It is spread through the air, when people who have the disease cough, sneeze, or spit. Most infections in humans result in an asymptomatic, latent infection, and about one in ten latent infections eventually progresses to active disease, which, if left untreated, kills more than half of its victims. The classic symptoms are a chronic cough with blood-tinged sputum, fever, night sweats, and weight loss. Infection of other organs causes a wide range of symptoms. So LNSP continued its programme on awareness on T.B. An awareness camp for early detection of T.B. were organised in Different blocks of Jajpur district.

During the Current financial year the organization has implemented such types of awareness programme in Bari, Rasulpur, Korei and Binjharpur block of Jajpur district. Practicing physicians were invited as resource persons and told the participants what to do in case of suspected cases of TB.

Drug Eradication Programme

Drug addiction is a complex brain disease. It is characterized by compulsive, at times uncontrollable, drug craving, seeking, and use that persist even in the face of extremely negative consequences. Drug seeking becomes compulsive, in large part as a result of the effects of prolonged drug use on brain functioning and, thus, on behavior. For many people, drug addiction becomes chronic, with relapses possible even after long periods of abstinence.



The youth of today are addicted to a variety of drugs, which ruin their physical, psychological and mental health. Particularly in tribal Community many youths are affected with this addiction. Many a times due to insensitive handling of the drug addicts by their respective families it leads to broken homes. People with addiction and substance users need to be handled carefully. It is more of a

behavioral problem rather than a medical problem. Realizing this fact the Agency has been undertaking many awareness campaign programme and counseling programme in its operational area of Jajpur Town for the drug and substance abusers. We plan to establish and run a drug de-addiction-cum-rehabilitation centers in the future.

Campaign against Child labour

The future of a community is in the well being of its children. Child labor in Orissa is a human right issue for the whole world. It is a serious and extensive problem, with many children under the age of fourteen working in dhabas, hotels, garages, construction sites, bidi rolling units, carpet making factories, glass

blowing units and making fireworks with bare little hands. Though there are legal provisions against employing child labours in hazardous activities no body seems to bother about it. The main reason behind employing child labour is lack of sensitivity among the employers. According to the statistics given by Indian government there are 20 million child laborers in the country, while other agencies claim that it is 50 million. LNSP launched a sustained campaign on Prevention of Employing



Child labour in its each operational districts. In order to achieve the objectives we organized rallies, workshops, and seminars in each operational area. In addition to making awareness campaign the agency is also trying to get some of these children admitted into formal schools. In the Current financial year 27 nos. of child labour has enrolled in formal school. Besides rallies and sensitization camps are held regularly to dissuade the employers of child labours to employ them in hazardous work.

Awareness on Road Safety

Right from the birth, human beings develop a sense of safety to protect themselves from the environment. Safety is not only necessary for the individual but also for the society on the whole. The population now has grown up to an alarming level. Earlier, when there was no much pressure on land, man was free to move from place to place at his will. Now the condition is different. Over the past few years there has been an unprecedented rise in the vehicular traffic as a result of which many accidents are taking place on a regular basis. Sometimes many of these accidents become fatal. As a matter of fact most of the accidents occur due to the ignorance of the road users, which can be avoided by adhering to simple rules of road use. In order to spread the message of using the road safely Laxmi Narayan Seva Pratisthan organized rallies. Roadsides meetings to educate the people to use the road safely. On this occasion pamphlets, handbills, stickers were distributed containing the message of common road rules, which should be adhered to by all the road users.

Skill Development Training Programme Under the Flagship of JSS

Skill Development is the process of identifying the skill gaps and developing and honing these skills of individuals. The main objectives of the skill india programme is to provide adequate training in market-relevant skills to unemployed youths by 2022. It also aims to create opportunities for the development of talent within the country and

improve the overall scope and space for underdeveloped sectors. In reference to Jajpur district of Odisha state Rural poor boys and Girls go up to matriculation standard and then stop education without having any skill. LNSP has started Skill training programme to impart the Skill Training to the rural youth under the flagship of Jana Sikshan Sansthan (JSS) since 2007. The main objectives of JSS skill certification training scheme is to enable a large number of rural youth to take up industry-relevant skill training that will help them in securing a better livelihood.

LNSP conducts survey in rural communities to identify youth in need of training through evaluation of economic condition, educational Background and willingness to learn. After enrolling required number of students in different sectors, LNSP carries out the training programme in its JSS campus. LNSP appointed qualified and experienced technical staff. For value addition, there are regular guest lecturers from experts of the subject. At the campus there is a workshop of machineries & tools to provide practical knowledge in every sectors. Apart from regular teaching aids and practical in workshop, there are also arrangements to facilitate on job training to these poor youth. After completion of training in the campus, the successful candidates referred for internship in the industries. This gives them a platform to acquire skills and make even more competent. LNSP has tied up with some renowned industries in Odisha who has a demand for skilled workforce. After completion of rigorous training in Different sectors, these students get placed on wages in the respective industries easily.

Programme for the Aged (Old Age Home)

The organization has also setup a old age Home (Laxmi Narayan Old Age Home) at Ahiyas of Jajpur District. 50nos. of old age people of more than 60 years age group became the inmate of the Old age home. This is a continuous programme supported by Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment. Here in our Laxmi Narayan Old Age home, the inmates are mostly from neglected destitute elderly persons and widows. The inmate of the old age home were getting facilities i.e. free outing, yoga training, free fooding and indoor game. The majour objectives of the programme are to make them economically sound and develop acceptability in their family as well as in society. The beneficiaries of the club get themselves involved in such activities that would promote co-operation and fellow felling to enjoy their stay. Besides periodically counseling is made to understand the sentiment of the beneficiaries leading to their psychological development.



Swadhar Home

Swadhar Greh is a scheme implemented by Ministry of Women and Child Development through local NGOs which targets the women victims of different circumstances who are in need of institutional support for rehabilitation so they could lead their life with dignity. Laxmi Narayan Seva Pratisthan is a leading organization in Jajpur district has already set up swadhar geha in Ahiyas of Jajpur District since 2008. The major objectives of the project is to provide shelter, food, clothing and medical treatment to the women in distress who are without any social and economic support, to provide them legal support and guidance in which they can take steps for their readjustment in family and Society.

Our Beneficiaries of Swadhar scheme are victims of domestic violence, sexual assult, unwed mother, trafficking and widow momen.

Facilities available in LNSP's Swadhar Greh:

- We provide temporary residential accommodation with Provision of free food, clothing and medical facilities etc.
- Providing free Vocational and Skill Up gradation training for their economic Rehabilitation.
- Providing Counseling, awareness Generation and behavioral training to the needy women victims.
- Providing Legal Support and guidance to the Victims in which they can readjust in the society and accepted by their family members.

Other Welfare Programme

Village Development Programme

In the recent year Laxmi Narayan Seva Pratisthan has involved in Village development Planning process programme. In this awareness programme people have become aware of their own problems, identified their issues, Identified the resources of the villages and planned for their utilization. 12 village plan completed also 12 nos of consultation meeting has held with the stakeholders of the village. As per the village and GP plan 04 bore well, 9 CC roads, 06 farm ponds, 02 check dams, 02 approach roads and 06 tube wells constructed and 03 in process with the help of local administration. Community level workshops were organized to facilitate the capacity development at the community level to sustain the cooperatives. In these workshops various important issues concerning their well being such as agriculture development, health, sanitation and nutrition etc were also discussed.



Women's Empowerment Programme

The last decades have witnessed some basic changes in the status and role of women in our society. There has been shift in policy approaches from the concept of 'welfare' in the seventies to 'development' in the eighties and now to 'empowerment' in the nineties and Twenties. This process has been further accelerated with some sections of women becoming increasingly self-conscious of their discrimination in several areas of family and public life. They are also in a position to mobilize themselves on issues that can affect their overall position. There is no doubt about the fact that development of women has always been the central focus of planning since Independence. Empowerment is a major step in this direction but it has to be seen in a relational context. A clear vision is needed to remove the obstacles to the path of women's emancipation both from the Non government, government and women themselves. Efforts should be directed towards all round development of each and every section of Indian women by giving them their due share.

SHG Strengthening Programme

Over the past few years there has been growing talks on women empowerment. As part of the programme women self-help groups are formed which are successfully used many areas to bring in a socio-economic change of the rural women. LNSP is also trying to emulate the model which has been successfully replicated in other areas. In the reporting year the organization had conducting different training programme for the SHG members in its operational area of Jajpur district for effective promotion of SHG groups for the development of women. In these camps women were explained the concept of SHG and the possible advantages that they can derive by forming viable groups. The women were explained the operative procedures of running SHGs. The members of the SHGs are motivated and provided adequate training to take up the habit of savings. In the long-term we have specific plans to link up these groups to banks and local financial institutions for a greater impact.



Looking Ahead

The year 2019 – 2020 was an eventful year for Laxmi Narayan Seva Pratisthan in which it undertook many meaningful programmes for the target group. In spite of many achievements we faced certain difficulties. The biggest hurdle for attaining the long-term goals for the organization was lack of resources. There was absolutely no external assistance except form some individuals and local

organizations. So all the envisaged activities for the year could not be pursued in the right earnest. Thus it was decided that the organization will seek financial assistance from various government and nongovernmental sources to implement al the programmes effectively. In the next financial year we would like to put more emphasis on Skill Development Training Programme, Programmes for the Senior Citizens, Women Empowerment and Agricultural Development etc.
